

Main Theme:

God measures faithfulness, not fullness.

Stewardship is not about how much we have, but how we honor God with what we do have.

Key Points for Your Talk

1. Stewardship is About Trust, Not Quantity

- God isn't asking us to manage abundance; He's asking us to be faithful with what's already in our hands.
- Sometimes lack is a test—can we still be disciplined, grateful, and generous with less?
- A quote I always remember is “do not mistake a lack of opportunity as discipline or salvation” meaning when you are in lack allow that to be a time that you really evaluate what is the habit or lifestyle change you need to implement

Scripture:

“Whoever can be trusted with very little can also be trusted with much.” — Luke 16:10

2. Stewardship in Lack Trains the Heart

- Lack teaches dependence on God instead of on self.
- Managing \$100 well prepares you for \$10,000. Managing one talent prepares you for five.

Scripture:

“Well done, good and faithful servant. You have been faithful with a few things; I will put you in charge of many things.” — Matthew 25:21

3. Stewardship Isn't Just Money

- Time: Are we faithful with the 10 minutes of prayer we have?
- Gifts: Are we using the one skill we already know instead of waiting for “more”?
- Relationships: Are we honoring the few friends or family we've been given?

Scripture:

“Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God’s grace in its various forms.” — 1 Peter 4:10

4. Stewardship in Lack Builds Multiplication

- The little boy’s lunch (5 loaves, 2 fish) seemed small, but in Jesus’ hands it fed thousands (John 6).
- Stewardship isn’t just managing; it’s positioning our little for God to multiply.

Scripture:

“Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine...” — Ephesians 3:20

Relatable Hook for Tonight

“We live in a world that says, ‘I’ll give when I have more.’ But the Kingdom says, ‘I’ll trust you with more when I see how you steward what you already have.’ Stewardship isn’t waiting for abundance—it’s worship in the middle of lack.”

Mic-Ready Closer

“Ladies, God doesn’t bless excuses, He blesses faithfulness. Stewardship is our declaration that even in lack, I trust God with what’s in my hand—because I know He’s the God who multiplies.”
