Reflection & Journal Guide

Scripture Focus

Luke 16:10 — “Whoever can be trusted with very little can also be trusted with much.”

Matthew 25:21 — “Well done, good and faithful servant...”

1 Peter 4:10 — “Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards...”

Reflection Questions

- In what area of my life do I feel I have “little” right now (time, money, energy, opportunities)?
- How have I been tempted to wait for “more” before being faithful?
- What is one “small” thing I can honor God with today?
- How does my view of lack change when I believe God multiplies what I place in His hands?
- Who around me can benefit from my faithfulness, even if I feel like I don’t have much?

Journaling Prompts

- Gratitude Prompt: Write down 3 things God has already placed in your hand—even if they feel small.
- Action Prompt: What is one small act of stewardship I can commit to this week (tithing a small amount, dedicating 15 minutes to prayer, encouraging one friend)?
- Faith Prompt: Write a prayer asking God to help you remain faithful in lack, trusting Him as the God of multiplication.

Takeaway Truth

“Stewardship is worship: it’s saying, ‘God, I trust You with the little in my hand, because I know You are the God of much.’”
